Breeding Doe Kid Regulations:

1. Ownership: Exhibitors must maintain continuous ownership, possession and provide daily care for each Doe Kid entered in the show from the time of nomination until show day. Exhibitors may show three breeding does.

2. Nominations: To be eligible for the show, all breeding does must have been nominated through the OYE manual, on-site nomination process at one of the three following locations and times:

Muskogee County Fairgrounds, Muskogee, OK – Tuesday, October 30, 2007 – 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Grady County Fairgrounds, Chickasha, OK – Wednesday, October 31, 2007 – 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Chisholm Trail Expo Center, Enid, OK – Thursday, November 1, 2007 – 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

A scrapie tag must be present in the ear of all doe kids at the time of the show. (A scrapie tag may be obtained from a county agent, a Vo-Ag teacher or the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture). Any breed or combination of breeds can be shown.

Breeding does do not have to be registered to be shown.

3. Identification: A scrapie tag and an OYE nomination tag will be required on all animals at the time of the show.

4. Horns. Dehorning of goats in this show is not suggested; however horns should be tipped and rounded. Goats with horns sharper than deemed safe by the show superintendent or fair staff will be required to be tipped or rounded or isolated and not shown.

5. Stall Assignments: Stalls are assigned by the goat superintendents based on number of market wethers and breeding does entries and space available. Without exception, goat stall assignments are based on where a 4-H or FFA member attends school.

6. Weight: Minimum weight requirement for breeding does is 50 pounds. **Maximum weight limit is 160 pounds.** There is no official weigh-in of breeding does. Official scales will be available for exhibitors to use in determining weight for the official entry card which must be turned in by Tuesday, March 11, 2008, 3:00 p.m. for classification. The top five placing animals in each class will be weighed and any animal that differs by more than 5 pounds from weight submitted by the exhibitor on the official entry card will be disqualified and the placing of all animals below will be moved up by one and top 5 placing animals weighed.

- 7. Weight Classes:** The superintendent will determine the number of classes based on entries so that each class is composed of no more than 40-55 animals.
- 8. Grooming:** Artificial coloring, paint and powder are not permitted for use in the breeding doe division during the show.
- 9. Shearing:** Length of hair is left up to the discretion of the exhibitor.
- 10. Bracing:** Bracing of animals will not be tolerated and result in dismissal by the judge or superintendent. The animals must have all four feet on the ground. Animals must be shown with a collar used only to control the animal. Exhibitor can only transiently touch the animal with his body. Exhibitor cannot use the collar to make the animal tense his muscles. Any violation will result in dismissal.
- 11. Health:** Any animal with abscesses will NOT be allowed to remain on the fairgrounds. Goats must be free from external parasites, ringworm and warts.
- 12. General Rules:** Review the General Rules and Regulations for all exhibitors and animals listed elsewhere in this publication. These rules and regulations will apply in the doe kid show.
- 13. Sale:** The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion breeding does along with eighteen additional doe kids as chosen by the judge will be sold at the Fifth Annual Oklahoma Youth Expo Premier Doe Sale to be held at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 12, 2008. Both registered and commercial does will be sold. **ALL DOE KIDS SELECTED FOR THE DOE SALE MUST SELL!** Each exhibitor is only allowed to sell one animal. A 15% commission will be collected on each doe in the sale. An exhibitor will be allowed to purchase the animal back, but must pay the commission. The judge determines the sale order.
- 14. Testing:** All breeding does are subject to be tested for unauthorized compounds.
- 15. Muzzles:** The use of hydration utensils and the use of soft muzzles are permitted in the stalls only. Soft muzzles must be removed from goats any time they are taken from their stall for any reason. Failure to use hydration utensils and soft muzzles only in the stalls will constitute disqualification.
- 16. Generators:** No generators will be allowed to operate inside the goat barns. No fans will be allowed in the aisles at any time.
- 17. Teeth: All doe kids must have their milk teeth at the time of nomination.**
- 19. Animal Substitution:** An exhibitor may substitute one animal for another of the same species and sex as long as each animal has been properly nominated and/or satisfies all of the show eligibility requirements such as ownership, age, etc. Animals that do not meet the proper nomination requirements or other show eligibility requirements cannot be substituted for other animals. **ANIMALS MAY NOT BE SUBSTITUTED ACROSS SPECIES OR SEX.** Examples are below:
- Ex. 1 – An exhibitor may substitute a barrow for a barrow or a heifer for a heifer.
 - Ex. 2 – An exhibitor may NOT substitute a barrow for a gilt (different sex) or a wether for a steer (different species).
 - Ex. 3 – An exhibitor also may NOT substitute a market wether lamb for a market ewe.

Class Premiums
